MY TEAMMATE IS EXPERIENCING EXTRAORDINARY PAIN

It's good for us to focus our attention on the good. To push for results that are constantly up and to the right. We need to be concerned about ROI. Mountaintops matter. But our responsibilities as a Faith Driven Entrepreneur go well beyond just providing financial security for our employees.

We're called to pursue real and meaningful relationships with people. And this includes the mess of life beyond eight to five.

What does it look like for us to be with our employees and their families in the valleys as well as the peaks? These are the moments when emotions run high and productivity understandably runs low. Still, people will remember these moments and they will leave a lasting impression. What can you do as a Faith Driven Entrepreneur to ensure that these times of tragedy will be met with the love of Jesus? A love that is unconditional and non-judgemental?

The first line of 1 Corinthians 13:8 is such a direct and simple reminder for us all: "Love never fails."

Love never fails. Period.

Times like these are when our faith will be tested. Both as the person going through something and the person who is trying to be of support. Questions will be asked. Doubt will emerge. Despair will set in.

What can you do to make sure that you are offering peace rather than adding stress? How will you love well?

It begins with just being there for someone. No agenda. No expectations. No pressure to have all the answers. Simply be attentive and accessible. Our only responsibility is to love.

Let's talk more about caring for our teammates who are experiencing pain.

Group Discussion	 Group Discussion: Ask each person to share and incorporate any learnings from the video. Here are a few questions to get you started: Where are you at in your journey of creating a company? What interest do you have, if any, in scaling your business? Facilitator asks if any members would like to share an action they are committing to take this month based on the discussion. Group members share any practice they would like to start or discontinue in their personal life of business via Zoom chat or post-it note Other members agree to pray for and hold them accountable 	45-60 mins
(Optional) Business Spotlight	 One individual presents information on their business venture. One person shares about their business model, stage and scope Participants ask questions and get to know more 	10 mins
Prayer	The group wraps in a time of prayer and encouragement	10 mins

Discussion Questions

ARE YOU WILLING TO BE INTERRUPTED?

At the end of the day, we have a business to run. And with that comes a host of responsibilities and obligations. Still, we need to remember that our primary purpose as a Faith Driven Entrepreneur lies beyond the P&L statement. It resides with the people we employ and work with day after day.

- Do you find it difficult to tear yourself away from the operations of your business in order to focus on the needs of the people you work with?
- What can you do to make people the priority?
- How can you embrace interruption as a prompting from God rather than a nuisance?

LOVE NEVER FAILS

The Apostle Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 13:8 that love never fails. No qualifiers. No exceptions. Just a statement.

- What would it take for you to institute this kind of approach in your business?
- What kind of initiatives or programs could you implement with this in mind?
- Is it possible to love your employees with no agenda or expectation in a way that is beneficial to your company as well?

5 Ideas to Explore the Mark Further

There's no limit to the ways you can explore the Marks of a Faith Driven Entrepreneur. What we provide below are five ideas we think might lead each one of us to an even greater understanding of our God-given call to create.

- 4. Act Differently: Spend time loving people simply because they are made in the image of God. Push past their political affiliations, social views, and religious beliefs. What do you notice when you focus on the value of a person?
